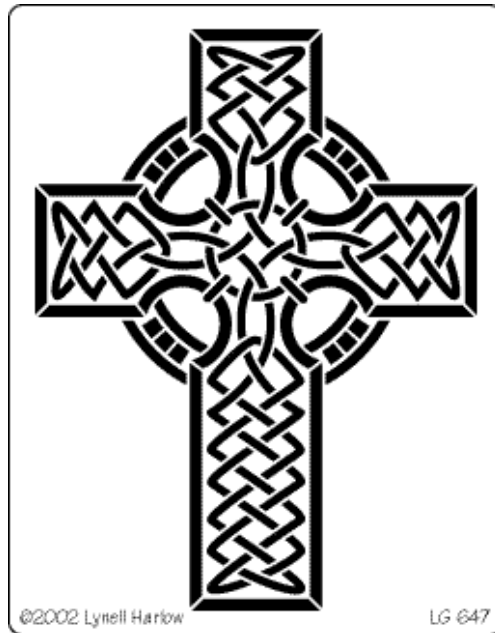

Everyone applauded the Vestry. Fr. Michael thanked Lisa for her dual role as Jr. Warden and Clerk. On the agenda Anthony Velez was mistakenly left off the list of Vestry Members and Fr. Michael apologized for that. Fr. Michael then appointed Tim Lueth and Ron Hunt as Tellers to count ballots. They both accepted.

Minutes of the January 25, 2009 Annual Meeting

We then reviewed the 2009 minutes. Dene Ann Parker moved to dispense with the reading of the 2009 minutes and Shannon Campbell seconded it. The motion passed unanimously. Ruby Hefley moved to accept the 2009 minutes as presented and Don Grant seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

Judy Wilson read the Treasurer's Report and answered questions from the floor.

2010 Budget as Approved by the Vestry

The 2010 budget was then discussed. According to the St. Mary's by-laws and the Diocesan Canons the Vestry adopts the budget and it is then presented at the Annual Meeting approved by the Vestry December meeting. There was some discussion of a few line items.

Questions and answers followed a few of these reports.

Election of Vestry, Delegates, and Alternates

We then moved on to the Vestry Election. There were three (3) three-year seats and two (2) one-year seats up for election. Mike Ward, chairman of the Nomination Committee, presented four (4) nominations: Peter Cabbiness (3 year term), Kyle Campbell (3 year term), Jack Van Patten (3 year term) and Gerald Hatler (1 year term).

Fr. Michael then called for additional nominations from the floor. Walt Baun, Chuck Shaheen and Ginny Engel were nominated from the floor for the 1 year term.

The ballots were passed out and the following people were elected:

We then moved on to the election of two (2) Diocesan Convention Delegates. Tom Metry and Jack Van Patten were nominated. Chuck Shaheen moved that we elect these two people by acclamation. Walt Baun seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously and Tom Metry and Jack Van Patten were elected as our Diocesan Delegates.

We then moved on to the election of at least two (2) Alternate Diocesan Delegates. Alternate Delegates nominated were; Ron Hunt, Tim Lueth, and Elaine Lynn. Don Grant moved to close nominations for Alternates and Jennifer Ward seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Jack Van Patten moved that we elect these three people by acclamation. Peter Cabbiness seconded. The motion passed unanimously and the Alternates were all elected by acclamation. Alternates elected were Ron Hunt, Tim Lueth and Elaine Lynn.

Tom motioned that the Vestry should select the order of the Alternates and Chuck Shaheen seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.

Stewardship Education Chair

Mike Ward volunteered to be the Stewardship Education Chair and Shannon Campbell volunteered to co-chair.

Rector's Closing Remarks and Blessing

Fr. Michael thanked us all for our cooperation and participation in the Annual Meeting. Fr. Michael then closed the meeting with a prayer and a blessing.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 3:05 pm with a short meeting of the new Vestry following.

2010 Rector's Report

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord sure is doing amazing things at Saint Mary's! 2010 was a year filled with worship, service, prayer, and study of the Word of God, as well as increased outreach and in-reach ministries.

We continued to offer three worship services each weekend (1928 BCP Holy Communion on Saturday at 6:30pm, and 1979 BCP Rite II Holy Eucharist on Sundays at 8:00am and 10:30am), as well as numerous opportunities for weekday worship such as Mass during Holy Days, Stations of the Cross on Friday's during Lent, a monthly Healing Service the 3rd Friday of each month, Morning and Evening Prayer during certain times of the year, and an Advent Service of Lessons & Carols. Our Music Ministry Team, Lectors, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, Acolytes & Crucifers, Scribes, Altar Guild, Ushers, our Deacon and all the other quiet un-named ministries gave their time and talent by helping us all to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness each week.

Our Youth Group continued to grow and mature during 2010. Youth Group is led by Cody Cabbiness and Tina Marie Tecson and supervised by Peppy Sclafani. Youth Group is open to all teens age 13+ from our parish and community. Youth Group members assisted during our Spring/Summer Youth Programs Yard Sale Fundraiser as well as our Vacation Bible School ministry and Angel Tree ministry. Youth Group gathers twice a month for fellowship, fun, prayer, and Bible Study. For more information please see the Youth Ministry and Youth Group reports below.

There were many opportunities to study the Word of God this past year. Some studies were lay-led and some were clergy led and all were spirit filled. Studies included specific books of the Bible, a study on Christianity vs Islam, the Truth Project, and others. Each month there was 14-20 opportunities to attend some form of adult Bible Study/Christian Education. For more information please see the Christian Education and Bible Study reports below.

Saint Mary's is a parish focused on studying the Word of God we are also a parish focused on prayer. We have no less than six distinct prayer ministries available at Saint Mary's. Every day of the week individuals and groups are praying for the needs of our members, of our clergy, and of our community. We communicate with God through prayer, and so prayer is an extremely important part of the life of our parish. For more information please see the Prayer Ministry report below.

Outreach is another area of ministry that is vital to the mission of the church. It is through our outreach ministries that we are called to share the love of Christ with the world around us as we minister in the Name of our Lord to those in need. We are taught by Jesus to be a servant to others as He washes the feet of His disciples on Maundy Thursday and then tells them and us to go and do likewise. At Saint Mary's we have several opportunities for outreach ministries such as our weekly Food Pantry collection, Youth Group ministry, the Daughters of the Holy Cross ministering to the residents at the Pacific Gardens Nursing Home, Vacation Bible School offered to members of the community, Angel Tree, and the Golden Living Center ministry. For more information please see the assorted ministry reports below.

Our Jr. Warden and many others gave of their time and talent to beautifying our church campus and glorifying God in the process. Several repairs to the church property were undertaken, the tree landscape project was completed, and two Christian artists from our community donated their time and talent by painting the beautiful and unique mural of the Last Supper on the north side of the Bishop Rivera Building. For more information please see the Jr. Warden's report below.

During 2010 we were blessed to welcome two new members into the Body of Christ through the Holy Sacrament of Baptism. We were present during the laying-on of hands in the Holy Sacrament of Confirmation of nine members of the Body of Christ (three teens and six adults) and the Reception of one adult member of the Body of Christ. We also celebrated the passing-on into paradise of four members of the Body of Christ. We saw some members of our church family leave our parish and we welcomed others into our midst.

On the ecumenical front, it was a joy to offer a joint Vacation Bible School with the Grove Community Church in which more than 75 kids and 50 adults from our two churches and our community participated. Saint Mary's also hosted our 2nd Annual Ecumenical Advent Lessons & Carols in which pastors and members from five different churches participated. We also continue to host a weekly Pastor Prayer Fellowship where pastors from the Sunnyside community come together to grow relationships, prayer for each other and out churches, thereby strengthening the Body of Christ.

2010 continued to be a year of economic uncertainty, challenges, and even hardship for many in our nation, and especially many right here in our own community. Saint Mary's was not immune to those challenges. As a matter of fact along with other parishes in our diocese, as well as most churches in the many different denominations in our community, we experienced those challenges and hardships first hand. 2010 was a very difficult financial year for many, if not most, and almost all the experts predict that 2011 will not be much better. But God promises us that if we put our trust in Him He *will* provide for our needs. He reminds us of that promise over and over in the Holy Scriptures. Thus far He *has* provided for our needs, and will continue to do so as long as we remain faithful to Him and His Word. He has blessed us with the resources needed to carry us through these difficult times, and along with the generous hearts of so many in our parish family I am certain our needs will be met in 2011 and in the coming years.

2010 did not see a resolution of the Property Law Suit filed by the Episcopal Church against our diocese and therefore against our own parish property and assets. As a matter of fact we were dealt a fairly substantial blow to our case by the trial judge in the spring of 2010. However, we were later blessed with a substantial victory when that judge's decision was reversed by the 5th Court of Appeals this past November. We are now awaiting our "day in court" when we will have an opportunity to have this case brought to trial later this year. It would appear that the appeal decision seems to have tilted the scales in our favor. While we hope and pray that in the end we are allowed to keep our church property and assets, I think that we at Saint Mary's understand that the church is not the buildings and assets, but that the church is instead **us** – the Body of Christ. We are the church, we are Saint Mary's, and nothing will ever change that. 2011 may or may not see a final resolution to this old and drawn out issue, but whatever does happen, God is with us because we have remained faithful to Him and to His Word and we have trusted in His provision. There has been a cost to remaining faithful. As individuals, as a parish, and as a diocese we have made many sacrifices and we might be called on to make even more sacrifices. But no matter what, we *will* continue to remain faithful to the LORD in 2011 and in the years beyond, and God will continue to remain faithful to us!

The Holy Spirit has certainly been at work in the life of our wonderful parish in 2010, and if we allow Him to He will continue to work through us and will do even more amazing things in 2011. We are so blessed to be part of a parish family focused on worshipping God, on prayer, on studying the Word, and on sharing the Love of Christ. I pray that God will use each of us in mighty ways in 2011 and that when He calls us individually and corporately we don't hesitate to answer His call. May 2011 be filled with many blessings as we seek to bless others by being His hands and feet used by Him to help build the Kingdom of God as we labor in His harvest. *"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest"* Matthew 9:37-38.

2010 Deacon's Report

I have been at St. Mary's now for one year and it has been a delight and honor to serve you. The diaconate is a service ministry. The word *diakonos* (deacon) literally means a servant and in particular a waiter. You can read in Acts 6 where the Twelve appointed Stephen and six others to provide for the distribution of food to the Hellenist widows – they were called to wait of tables. Scripture tells us they did more than just wait on tables, they prayed for them and we are specifically told that Stephen, “full of grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people”.

The diaconal ministry serves to compliment and enlarge the ministry and effectiveness of the laity, as well as the parish priest. The primary liturgical duties of the deacon are to prepare the table for Holy Communion, proclaim the gospel, offer the prayers of the people, administer the Eucharistic chalice, and to dismiss the congregation at the end of the service. The words “Go in peace to love and serve the Lord” at the dismissal are an invitation by the deacon to take what you have received out into the world – to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with your neighbor or anyone that God has put in your path.

Here are words the bishop spoke to me at my ordination:

“My sister, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ, serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely. As a deacon in the church you are to study Holy Scripture, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them. You are to make Christ and his redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship. At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself.”

One of my ministries is reaching out to those in need at Poverello House the fourth Sunday of each month. As a team we not only offer a worship service, but we spend time listening and praying with the homeless. It is especially rewarding when one of us are able to help an individual with a special need. There is much to be done both within our church family and in the world around us. Let's all go out into the world to love and serve the Lord. Blessings to you all!

Multi Cultural Bible Study Report 2010

Lessons in our Adult Sunday School are repeated every Tuesday at 6:30 pm in the Bishop Rivera Building. We call this “St. Mary’s Multi-Ethic Bible Study.” This ministry is attended by some from our parish and some from other churches around us. Although everybody is welcome every Tuesday, so far only four white Americans and few Filipinos currently attend this ministry. Some Mexicans and Afro-Americans expressed intentions to attend but failed to come.

I am currently praying and contemplating on letting others take over this ministry because I want to concentrate more on a new ministry we are to launch this February—a ministry that would train those who will be interested in personal evangelism and nurture of new believers.

2010 Music Ministry Team Report **Submitted by Shannon Campbell**

First of all, I'd like to thank Father Michael, the Music Ministry Team (Ron, Annette, Theresa, Bob, Rita, Don, Tim, and Deborah), and the St. Mary's family for the opportunity to serve as the music ministry leader for the past church year. It has been such a blessing to me. As with all ministries, it is important to take inventory of where we have been, where we are at, and where we are headed. This past year there was the challenge of incorporating essentially two music ministry teams into one unified team. The choir and praise band were brought together to lead the worship of the congregation. Some things were lost (variety of instruments, praise team and/or choir members, more "modern" worship music selections, and a service that was focused heavily on the music aspect of worship) and some things were gained (blended worship style incorporating "contemporary" worship selections with traditional hymns, and more consistent worship throughout the weeks). One thing that I feel that has strengthened the ministry of the music team of St. Mary's is this union of the two groups as it has demonstrated an "our" ministry rather than a "their" or "my" ministry. We come together as a ministry team to assist both the clergy and the congregation during corporate worship by leading the congregation in songs of praise.

No greater example of corporate worship this year was than that of our Annual Lessons and Carols. This allowed many churches in our area to come and hear the message of the story of salvation, partnered with and supported by contemporary musical selections that reflected the lessons read. The turn out and response was tremendous. The hope is that next year, choir members from participating churches could join our ministry team.

Right now on the music ministry team, we have a total of nine members. In a typical Sunday, we have about four to five present on a weekly basis. My personal hope for this next year is to add dedicated voices to the ministry team and have them offer up more anthems appropriate to the church season.

I hope to, this year, while coordinating with St. Mary's Music Ministry Team (and Fr. Michael and other interested members of the congregation) for input, create a songbook compiling regularly used musical selections not found in our hymnal so that we can reduce weekly copies and compile a repertoire of music that is and/or will be familiar to the congregation. Each year, the songbook can undergo review to remove selections that may not work, and add a few newer selections.

Finally, on a personal level, I have struggled with my role as music team leader and have made a personal commitment to engage in a study of worship in the church and worship as it is described in scripture to rekindle the spirit of worship in my own role as a music team leader. In essence I long to identify true worship and how I can, as team leader bring that into corporate worship within the church. While it is truly a blessing to be called to serve the Lord through the sharing of musical gifts, it has been a challenge

to me as challenges in my personal life have led me to thirst to be more of a participant of worship than a leader. I know that my calling is to use my gifts and talents here at St. Mary's, and God has not released me of that role, so as I continue in that role, I desire to seek out what it is that God is teaching me through these personal trials, and how I can continue to rejoice in Him . . . always.

Intercessory Prayer Ministry is a very important part of the life of Saint Mary's. There are several ways to add your prayer needs to this Ministry.

We have a very dedicated group of prayers warriors that make up the Saint Mary's Prayer Chain. The Prayer Chain should be used for immediate emergency prayer needs, and can be activated by calling Jane Lehman at 237-0196. This ministry has faithfully and tirelessly served our parish for many years.

The Prayer Board in the back of the church is also available for both immediate and long-term prayer needs. To add a prayer need to the Prayer Board simply call the office at 255-4883 and either speak with Maryann or leave a voice mail message for her and the prayer need will be added to the board. Every member of the parish is encouraged to check the Prayer Board regularly and to add those prayer needs to your daily prayer time.

At the entrance of the church is a small podium with a Worship Service Prayer List. A new list is put out each Saturday for names to be added as needed. The needs on this list are prayed for by name during each worship service and also throughout the week.

We are blessed to have a local chapter of the Daughters of the Holy Cross (DHC) at Saint Mary's. Each member of the DHC takes vows of daily prayer, study, evangelism, and service. Saint Mary's chapter of the DHC prays for very specific prayer needs of our parish, clergy, and community. DHC prayer needs are strictly confidential. If you have a prayer need that you would like the DHC to aware of all you have to do is let any one of the daughters know, and she will share that need in confidence with the rest of the daughters, and they will add the need to their daily prayers.

Another new prayer ministry that was birthed in 2010 is the lay-led Thursday Night Prayer Meeting. This prayer group is open to everyone and meets in the Bishop Rivera Building on Thursday evenings from 6:30pm to 7:30pm for one hour of silent and verbal extemporaneous prayer. Being your Treasurer for the year 2010 was a pleasure & an honor. I am humbled at the support I have received from Fr. Michael, the Vestry & the Church & will do my best for the good of St. Mary's. This has been a very exciting year. We have met all our obligations, paid all our bills, supported our Missionaries, contributed to our Building Fund & sent our youth to camp on half scholarships. We have an ending balance in our checking account of \$9,371.30, our savings account (Building Fund) of \$6,268.08 & our Money Market account of \$77,355.35 as of 12/31/10.

The State of California owes St. Mary's \$7,820.00 for their portion of the State Grant Trees Fund monies. St. Mary's has paid out these funds from our own accounts & is waiting for reimbursement. Thanks to Brandy Swisher things are moving forward on this & we should see the reimbursement very soon.

Each month I have attended the Vestry meetings & supplied them with a detailed explanation of each of our expenses that exceed the budgeted amounts for that month along with the financial reports on our income & expenses. This has helped both the Vestry & me in identifying anything out of the ordinary that needs to be discussed & corrected. Thank-you, Vestry!

The Vestry transferred \$20,000.00 from our Money Market account in Aug., 2010, to our general account to cover a monthly deficit between our income & expenses of \$4,000.00 for the next five months. Of these funds we have used \$10,628.70 as of 12/31/10 to pay our expenses.

Once again, "Thank-you" St. Mary's for putting your trust in me & I look forward to serving you another year as Treasurer.
